Detailed description of project

Type of services provided

The **overall objective** of the project was to support the building of an independent and efficient judicial system. The **project purpose** as defined in the contract was to ensure effective implementation of the Montenegrin judiciary reform.

The following results were achieved:

- Cost and benefit analysis elaborated as a first basis for institutional reorganisation of the court's network
- Exact overview over the degree of utilization of capacities elaborated, contributing to more efficiency in handling court cases and reducing or preventing backlogs
