<p>The specific objective was to support the Public Security Department and Correctional and Rehabilitation Centres Department (CRCD) of the Public Security Directorate (PSP) in its efforts to enhance the functioning of the Jordanian penitentiary system in accordance with EU standards and international human rights instruments, resulting in an improved respect for human rights as regards the treatment of detainees.</p> <p>The following results were achieved:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The institutional capacity of the CRCD strengthened • The administrative capacity of the CRCD strengthened • The penitentiary management system improved • Increased administrative capacity of the penitentiary staff in CRCs (Correctional and Rehabilitation Centres) and fostered respect for human rights achieved <p>Assessments on the current status of issues were tackled as well as – where necessary – needs & gaps analyses were accomplished by way of common work of the Beneficiary's and the Member State Partner's experts. Subsequently optional measures suitable for the successful implementation of the respective activity were elaborated and discussed with the Beneficiary on working and decision making level, and, after approval was reached, adopted and implemented, to fully meet the Beneficiary's requirements. In addition training courses for 56 trainees and 54 trainers were accomplished and study visits for approx. 40 participants to Austria, Germany, Finland and Slovenia were organised.
